

Crisis Update (from BBC News 06/26/2024)

400 Kenyan troops have arrived in Haiti and interim Prime Minister Garry Conille has vowed to end lawlessness. "Working with Haitian police, and headquartered at a US-built base, the Kenyan officers will aim to take back key sites that have fallen under the control of gangs, including the nearby airport and sea ports.

Haiti has not had an election since 2016. So elections are to be organised within a year, and to allow that to happen, the Kenyan-led mission is being tasked with restoring security. Their deployment has been authorised for one year, with a review to be held after nine months." Our friends are so encouraged and please continue to pray for them, these troops and even the gang members that they might turn to God.

This little family suffered a senseless tragedy. The dad was killed by his own brother over a piece of land. They had to flee and have lost their husband, father, provider and protector and home. Our mission is immediately helping with food and clothing and has rented a house for them. Because of all that partner, this family is

experiencing love and hope from Jesus that will resonate with them forever.

We recently helped a desperate mother have a C-section. The mother's life was saved, but sadly, her baby boy passed to the arms of

Jesus. This is the first time in so many births we have assisted. Please pray for her.



A recent praise report of unknown but answered prayer was for a family with a baby trapped in Port Au Prince for months. They ran out of food and ate boiled leaves for days. The baby had no milk. Our mission helped them with both, Hallelujah!

This photo is Esdras helping people with food. It is so dangerous and expensive to buy. His life has been threatened many times. He's a true servant.

Dr. Max shared that last week, his own family's food was stolen by gangs after it was purchased so they lost their food and their money. And gangs have many roadblocks where they extort a lot of money.

Aren't these chickens a beautiful sight! One of the young boys in our Children's Home wanted to raise

them and we are beyond proud of him.

Esdras and his wife, Develine, consider each child in the Home as their own, and each is loved, encouraged, and nurtured. Esdras has them participate in sharing the Gospel and Love of Christ in our mission work whenever possible to instill being a servant of Jesus.

Just want to leave you with personal accounts of how desperate it is in Haiti. Dr. Max shared one uncle has cancer of the throat. He could not breathe, so Dr Max took him to the Dominican Republic in September. He received a trach, but no cancer treatment due to cost. He fell and broke his hip ball off in February and only been treated for pain since. The hip ball is still in there broken off. His cancer is now in final stages and nothing more the doctors can do for him. He will ride flat 6 hours to the border, be removed and physically carried across the border and endure another 6 hours to Montrouis. Once in Haiti they will stop and pay gangs many times. His other uncle has terrible diabetes and was in a coma. He came out but has terribly high and low readings for weeks. Many times, there is no insulin to be found. Life is so very hard. Even today, Esdras said this: "The pain is too much down here. When that day arrives to leave this earth, it's will be a glory day for us who are in Christ" Please remember them all in your prayers
